

Present simple and present continuous

Read the rule and **choose** the correct option.

- Use the present *simple/continuous* to talk about facts, things which are generally true or something that happens regularly.

Every day, we wake up early, I make coffee and my boyfriend walks the dog.

- Use the present *simple/continuous* to describe something happening now.

The sun is shining, and the birds are singing.

- You can also use the present continuous to describe a permanent/temporary situation happening around now.

I am currently experimenting with new ways to store our clothes.

- We use the present *simple/continuous* with stative verbs.

My boyfriend is checking the van because we <u>need</u> to fix the engine.

- It is common to use time expressions like at the moment, right now and these days with the present simple/continuous.

Right now, I am sitting outside and drinking my coffee.


- It is common to use time expressions like usually, sometimes, always, never, often, seldom, rarely, on Mondays, every day... with the present simple/continuous.

Every day, we wake up early, I make coffee and my boyfriend walks the dog.

PRESENT SIMPLE VS PRESENT CONTINUOUS

present simple

I live in a van with my boyfriend, our cat, and our dog.



- Things which are always true, facts. The sun rises in the morning.
- Habits or things we do regularly. Every day, we wake up early, I make coffee and my boyfriend walks the dog.
- We use the present simple and not continuous with stative verbs: be, want, cost, need, belong, like, love, hate, dislike, fear, know etc. My boyfriend is checking the van because we need to fix the engine.

present continuous

Right now, I am sitting outside and drinking my coffee.




- Things which are happening at the moment of speaking. The sun is shining, and the birds are singing.
- Temporary situations. This month, we are working on organising the van better.
- Temporary or new habits. I am currently experimenting with new ways to store our clothes.

PRESENT SIMPLE VS PRESENT CONTINUOUS

present simple

I live in a van with my boyfriend, our cat, and our dog.



present continuous

Right now, I am sitting outside and drinking my coffee.





Look at the pictures and write about what people usually/sometimes do and what they are doing today/these days.


Example:

ROLE-PLAY

Example: Right now, I am preparing my van for a long trip.


- Ask John what he is doing at the moment.

- Respond to Emma's greeting and introduce yourself.
- Talk about your daily routine (use present simple). Example: I usually drive to different places and explore nature.
- Ask Emma more about her van life.
- Talk about what you are doing now (use present continuous). Example: At the moment, I am cooking dinner over the campfire.
- Ask follow-up questions to keep the conversation going.




